Ezra 10:1-44, The Gift of Repentance

The Situation from Ezra 9:

- Mixed marriage...it was a religious problem, *not* racial.
- Mal. 2, many of these forbidden marriages were a result of social advancement; men abandoning their Jewish wives for unbelieving Gentile daughters of wealthy land owners.
- PERHAPS this is *not* a call for divorce but a separation of illicit unions:
 - o "<u>Divorce</u>" <u>not</u> used, but a term describing those living in sin –common law?
 - o "<u>Foreign women</u>" <u>same</u> term for adulteress in Pr. 2:16, "[D]elivered from the forbidden woman, from the adulteress w/ her smooth words."

General guidelines about confession:

- 1. Confession is *not* the same as repentance. Confession is '*agreeing*' w/ God about our sin (1 Jn. 1:9). Repentance is a *change of mind that RESULTS* in a change of action.
- 2. Confession should be made to God & to one another (James 5:16).
- 3. Confession should be specific *and* thorough.
- 4. Public confession: required of public sins or public manifestations of private sins*
- 1) Genuine repentance includes heartfelt *sorrow* for your sin before a holy God.
- 10:2 2) Genuine repentance sees the sin as ultimately *against God*.
 - 3) Genuine repentance refuses to *blame others* for your sin.
 - 4) Genuine repentance *hopes* in God.
- 10:3-4 5) Genuine repentance *bears fruit* in keeping with repentance.

Mal. 2, "Gd hates divorce." Is this plan of Shecaniah approved by Gd? 4 Points to Consider:

- 1. <u>Divorce permitted in the OT</u> (different reasons). <u>Dt. 24:1</u>, "[S]he finds no favor in his eyes b/c he has found some indecency in her..." Could <u>NOT</u> refer to adultery (death penalty).
- 2. <u>Ruth??</u> NO indication these wives were foreigners who followed the Lord & married godly Israelites. *This* situation were men who lusted after foreign pagan women & married them.
- 3. Children sent away? Much like today in ancient culture: moms stay w/ the kids (Ishmael).
- 4. <u>Ezra's lack of discernment?</u> Commentators disagree. Nehemiah does <u>not</u> condemn Ezra, godly elders <u>agree with</u> Ezra... *This action is the lesser of 2 evils*.
- 10:7-9 6) Genuine repentance *submits* to the Lord's discipline.
- 10:12-15 7) Genuine repentance *fears* the Lord, not man.
- 10:25-44 8) Genuine repentance is *not* perfectionism, but a continuous way of life!
 - 9) Genuine repentance is a gift of God.
