Nehemiah 1:1-11, Nehemiah's Prayer

Introduction:

- Nehemiah: 3rd division of the Old Testament: the Writings. Continues the story of Ezra.
- <u>Author</u>: Nehemiah, governor of <u>Judah</u> (Persian province). <u>Cupbearer</u>: trusted, dangerous.
- The Book: Ch. 1-7, Rebuilding the Wall, Ch. 8-13, Rebuilding the People.
- Background of the captivity of Israel (northern kingdom) & Judah (southern kingdom):
 - o 722 BC, Israel (north), destroyed by the Assyrians (= Samaritans).
 - o 605, 597, 586, Judah (south) destroyed by the Babylonians, exiled 70 YRS.

<u>3 parts:</u> returns/rebuilds. Why does God bring back southern kingdom, not northern? <u>Jerusalem!</u>

- 538-515 BC, <u>1st return (50k)</u>: Zerubbabel rebuilds <u>temple</u>, (482-473 BC Events of Esther)
- 458 BC, <u>2nd return (5k)</u>: Ezra rebuilds the <u>people</u> (law). 80 YRS <u>after</u> the 1st return.
- 445-420 BC, <u>3rd return</u>: 13 yrs after Ezra, Nehemiah rebuilds the <u>wall</u>, (*Mal.* prophesy).

5 Sanctification Practices of a Believer:

- 1. A Believer's focus is upon what the Lord focuses (vss. 4-5).
- 2. A Believer brings his burdens to the Lord—doing so through prayer...even fasting (vss. 4-5).
- 3. A Believer can see sin as the problem & not afraid to confess when the need arises (vss. 6-7).
- 4. A Believer pleads the promises of God (vss. 8-10)
- 5. A Believer gets off the bench & gets into the game $\underline{b/c}$ he fears God over fearing man (v. 11).
